

She was born i 1930 Aurora, Nebraska, named after the nurse who helped deliver her! Her family lived on a farm near Pol She grew up with seven brothers an

one sister. She was the fourth born of the seven kids. Back then there was, of course, no electricity or running water. 1945 farms were being wired by REA - for electricity. She went to a country school through eighth grade and her transportation was walking or riding in a horse drawn wagon. They had a pony named Beauty. Arlene graduated from Polk High School in 1947. Her father died when she was in High School in 1945 and then her mother was a widow for 50 years. All seven of her brothers were at the service. Arlene was a soda jerk at the drug store for two years. When she was 17, she took a train to Minneapolis as her oldest brother lived in St. Louis Park. She got a job at General Mills working downtown and lived in South Minneapolis with four girls from Chaska. Arlene moved Minneapolis in January 1948. They lived in Brooklyn Park for 50 years until 1999.
